

## **San Diego Chapter of the Appraisal Institute Scholarship Program**

The sole purpose of the San Diego Chapter of the Appraisal Institute Scholarship (“Scholarship”) is to award financial scholarships to eligible Candidates for Designation and Practicing Affiliates in the San Diego Chapter. The Scholarships are decided by the Board of Directors as economic conditions allow.

### **Scholarship Award**

The award shall:

- consist of one complementary AI course per Scholarship Recipient;
- apply towards any education offered by the Chapter, with the exception of the Capstone Program;
- unless the course is not offered (at which point the Board may allow an exception as economic conditions dictate).

### **Scholarship Committee**

The function of the Scholarship Committee (“Committee”) of the San Diego Chapter (“Chapter”) of the Appraisal Institute is to determine criteria, and to evaluate and recommend Applicants to the San Diego Board of Directors.

- The Committee and Chairperson are appointed by the Chapter President each year.
- The Committee shall consist of three to five of the Chapter’s Designated Members.
- Ideally, at least one of the Committee members would also serve on the Chapter’s Education Committee.
- Ideally, at least one of the Committee members would also serve on the Chapter’s Candidate Guidance Committee.
- A majority vote of the Committee is required to recommend an Applicant.
- The Committee has the power to determine the Scholarship requirements.

### **Scholarship Eligibility**

The Applicant shall be either a Chapter Candidate for Designation or a Chapter Practicing Affiliate, in good standing, actively working toward a Designation, have passed all prior AI courses formally attended, have attended at least two Chapter luncheons in the past year, and have met any other requirements for the Scholarship.

Scholarship awards are limited to one per recipient.

### Scholarship Document Requirements

Applicants shall submit:

- their application no more than once annually;
- a resume and/or curriculum vitae;
- a list of completed AI courses;
- a statement assuring all prior AI classes were passed;
- a statement that they have not been accused or convicted of a felony;
- a list of all prior AI scholarship awards;
- a brief description of their financial need (if any);
- a brief description of how they are active at the Chapter;
- a brief description of how they are actively appraising; and
- a brief description of their the future career goals.
